Use this booklet before, during, and after cancer treatment. It covers common types of eating problems and ways you can manage them.



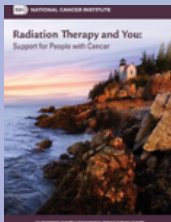

Northwestern Young Adult Cancer Monthly Programming:

We have 2 monthly support groups that run September-May each year . The 1st Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm is group open to those who have been diagnosed with cancer between the ages of 15-39 and are currently 18-39. You must have received care at Northwestern or Lurie Children's Hospitals to participate. The 2nd Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm is group dedicated to their supporters. We also have periodic "It's a C Thing" hangouts. This hangout is open to anyone diagnosed with cancer between the ages of 15-39 as well as a guest. Provides wellness & exercise services in Bronzeville to promote healthy living and to reduce the risk of cancer.

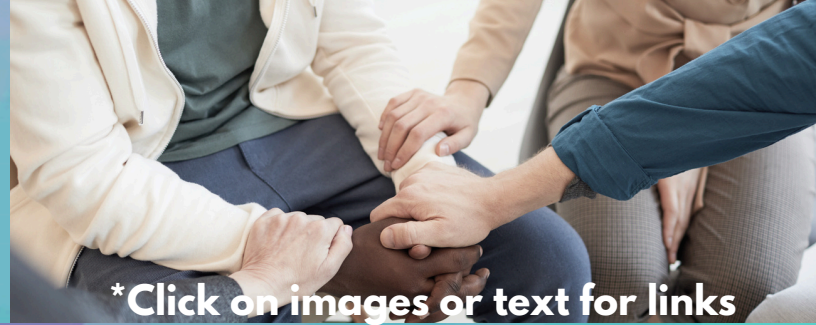

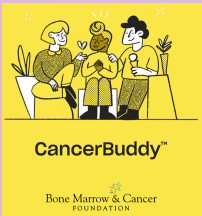

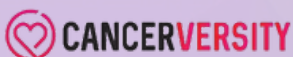

Offers free support to women diagnosed with cancer while pregnant. Connect women who are pregnant with cancer to others who have been there.



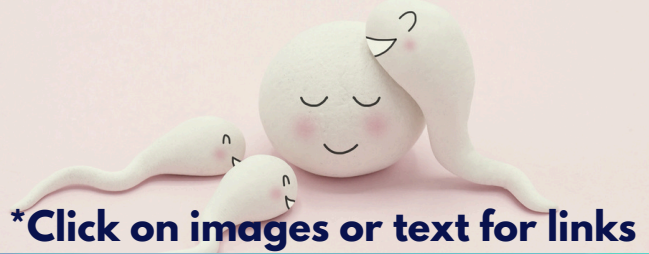

The SAMFUnd provides financial assistance grants for 21-39 year olds post treatment or on maintenance therapy.

Co-pay assistance and patient aid programs for specific diseases.



Provides scholarships for cancer patients and survivors to continue their education.



Provides college scholarships for young adults with cancer. (Ages 17-39)



Provides need-based financial support to young adults who are pursuing higher education in treatment and beyond. (Ages 18-35)

Cancer Insurance Checklist

A checklist designed to help you compare health insurance plans and consider your health needs when shopping for insurance.



A toolkit designed to help you navigate finances during and after cancer. Includes sections on health insurance, disability insurance, financial assistance and more.



Social Security pays disability benefits to people who cannot work because they have a medical condition. Apply for benefits by calling 1-800-772-1213 or also apply online.



Website for open enrollment. Multiple private insurance plans to choose from, no exclusions for pre-existing conditions, no lifetime limits, possible subsidy to help pay premiums.



Medicaid

Medicaid is joint federal/state insurance for low income and disabled individuals. Find information about Medicaid and learn how to apply.



Medicare

Medicare disability: Medicare eligibility expanded to include certain disabled individuals under the age of 65. Non-elderly individuals who have received disability payments for 24 months are eligible. Find information about Medicare and learn how to apply.



COBRA stands for the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act and it gives workers and families who lose their health benefits the right to choose to continue health benefits for limited periods of time under certain circumstances.

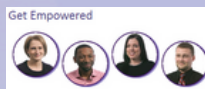

Riprap.org is a site for teenagers who have a parent with cancer. They can learn more about cancer and its treatment through real stories and other support.



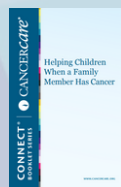
Support programs and resources for kids and teens with a parent with cancer.

Wish granting for children and young adults (ages 0-20) who have been diagnosed with a life threatening condition.



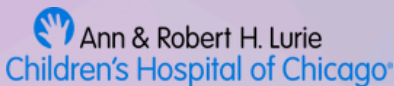

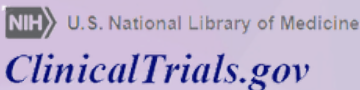
